



HIGH SCHOOL COURSE / GRADES / CREDIT

Credit for 8th grade classes will receive 10 credits and grade will appear on high school transcript. Classes that apply are Algebra 1 and Spanish. Notify CCS of classes selected.

Attending COC

Students that take classes at COC will receive high school credit and college credit. Semester academic subjects such as Algebra, Spanish and Science receive 10 credits (1 year) and the grade earned at COC. Other semester classes will receive 5 credits (1 semester).

College classes: Classes taken for an elective can receive high school course credit. Credit given is usually 5 credits per semester class.

Some classes receive more than 5 credits, if it is designed as a year long class taught in a semester. Some examples are Spanish 101= 10 credits. Check with CCS.

Some COC classes may receive credit as "Honors". Please contact CCS to see if your class applies.

Some classes at COC may not receive CCS credit. Please check with us prior to enrollment at COC.

CCS does not accept D's or F's from college classes.

A copy of a syllabus with our course description is required for all classes taken at COC.

Concurrent enrollments forms are needed to enroll at classes at COC and CCS.

Final grades from COC must be sent to CCS for course credit along with your completed Course Standard. CCS does not need an official transcript.

Transfer Students: Incoming students from other high schools with grades of D or below in Core Academic Subjects, i.e. Science, History, Math and English will not be given the D grade or credit on CCS transcript. Grades for these classes can be made up at home to earn a C or better.

If a class is repeated, the old and new grade will appear on the CCS transcript. But only the credit and the new grade will be the one factored into a student's GPA.

Repeating a class below a level at which student has already received high school credit will not be given additional high school credit.

High school classes taught by the parents will receive full credit.

*High school classes must include high school level course requirements. See CCS acceptable course requirements.

Parents must teach 51% of core subjects to receive CCS credit. Core subjects are defined as English, History, Science, Math, Economics and Government.

Non college classes, usually a tutorial or outside class, can receive full course credit or partial credit. Classes can be core subjects as long as 51% of other core classes are taught by the parent.

Any math will be given 10 credits regardless how long it took the student to complete the course work.
